Exhortation to Repentance

Brothers and sisters, let us fathom the meaning of this mystery. For when the Prodigal son fled back to his father's home, the good father came out to meet him and kissed him, giving to the Prodigal son once again his former glory, and rejoicing on high, he sacrificed the fatted calf.

Let our lives, then, be worthy of the prodigal-befriending Father who offered the glorious sacrifice—the Savior of our souls.

Prayers of Repentance of the Prodigal¹

great are the blessings, which in my wretchedness I have deprived myself!

Therefore, before the end, cry out to Christ God:

I have wasted the wealth which the Father has given me, and in my wretchedness I have fed with the dumb beasts, yearning for their food, I remained hungry and without my fill.

But I now return to the compassionate Father and cry out with tears:

I fall down before Your loving-kindness,

receive me as a hired servant and save me.

Create a pure heart for me, O God; renew a steadfast spirit within me.

I have wasted, and in my wretchedness spent, all the riches You have given me, O Savior, and having lived prodigally, I have been deceived by the demons. Therefore, turn me back, and accept me as the Prodigal, O compassionate Father, and save me.

Meeting with God through the way he has opened leads to benediction, while approaching YHWH through a manner he himself has not ordained results in judgment. One reason why this is so is because the unclean cannot come into contact with the holy without being destroyed." (L.
