[Dinner begins with "As We Gather" and open-prayer.]

1. Entrance

[Singing + Standing] Psalm 134 **C** ome, bless the Lord, all you servants of the Lord, who stand by night in the house of the Lord! Lift up your hands to the holy place and bless the Lord! The Lord bless you, He who made heaven and earth!

2. Purification

[Singing] The Lenten Hymn

et us go up to Jerusalem,

- where the Son of Man will be crucified.

[Standing] The Blessing

L et us stand, for it is time for the Lord to act. Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit, both now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.

[A woman places Communion on the table and lights the candles.]

[Singing]

O Gladsome Light, pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven, O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed! Now as we come to the setting of the sun, and our eyes behold the vesper light, we sing Your praises, O God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

² Or "Ascension," for his is where we ascend and enter into the heavenly realm. The candle symbolizes this entrance and our offering of thanksgiving is our gift.

You are worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices, O Son of God, O Giver of Life, and to be glorified through all the worlds.

Why do You hide Your face from me? I am wretched, close to death from my youth. I have borne Your trials; I am numb. Your fury has swept down upon me; Your terrors have utterly destroyed me. They surround me all the day like a flood; together they close in against me. Friend and neighbor You have taken away: my one companion is darkness.

S ince we have a great High Priest – Jesus, the Son of God – who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin: let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

⁴ "God's presence is never neutral; the result of engaging him must ever be either blessing or judgment. Meeting with God through the way he has opened leads to benediction, while approaching YHWH through a manner he himself has not ordained results in judgment. One reason why this is so is because the unclean cannot come into contact with the holy without being destroyed." (L. Michael Morales, *Who Shall Ascend the Mountain of the Lord?: A Biblical Theology of the Book of Leviticus*, 140.)
